

## MCC to MU Transfer Agreement for Parks Recreation and Tourism

A maximum of 62 credit hours will be accepted by MU from MCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Science in Parks, Recreation and Tourism.

Transfer students from MCC, upon acceptance into the Parks, Recreation and Tourism undergraduate program at MU, will have junior standing at MU.
