



The Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education Bridge Program for MACC and MU

This agreement provides students who have earned an Associate of Arts degree with an Emphasis in Elementary Education the opportunity to complete a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education at MU. Any MACC student who has earned an Associate of Arts degree is guaranteed that MU will accept designated freshman and sophomore teacher education credits, will accept all general education credits, and will apply such to the Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education degree in a manner consistent with the treatment of native students. Thirty of the last 36 semester hours of credit must be completed at MU (residency requirement) to be applied to the Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education. Transfer students from MACC, meeting the criteria listed below, upon acceptance into the teacher education program at MU, will have Phase II (professional) standing at MU for the Elementary Education degree program.

Conditions for Admittance into Phase II of the Teacher Development Program

- Satisfactory completion of EDU190 Introduction to Education, EDU230 Technology for Teachers, EDU240 Teaching and Learning, and EDU290 Education Capstone
- Completion of Education courses with a cumulative GPA of 2.500 or higher
- An overall cumulative GPA of 2.750
- An ACT composite score of 22 or higher or SAT score of 1010 or higher
- A score of 235 or higher on each subtest of the C-Base exam (The C-Base exam must be completed prior to transfer because all sections must be passed before entering Phase II.)

General information regarding the C-Base exam:

A student who does not meet the minimum required score may retake that section(s). Students will have two years from the first testing period to retake those portions of the exam in which they must raise their score. After two years, the entire exam must be retaken. A passing score is a Missouri Teacher Certification requirement. It is recommended students take this test after completing 45 hours of college credit. All sections must be completed and passed prior to transfer to MU.

- Completion of LAL102 Exposition and SPK101 Public Speaking I with a grade of "C" or higher in each course
- Completion of MTH140 College Algebra with a grade of "C" or higher
- Completion of MTH160 Elementary Statistics with a grade of "C" or higher
- Satisfactory completion of the A.A. Teacher Education Portfolio
- Completion of Application for Progression into Phase II of the MU Teacher Development Program
