

STLCC to MU Transfer Agreement in Elementary Education

Thirty of the last 36 semester hours of credit must be completed at MU (residency requirement) to be applied to the Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education.

Transfer students from SLCC, meeting the criteria listed below, upon acceptance into the teacher education program at MU, will have Phase II (professional) standing at MU for the Elementary Education degree program.

Criteria for Admittance to Phase II of the Teacher Development Program:

- Satisfactory completion of EDU:102 Computers in Education, EDU:200 Introduction to Classroom Teaching, EDU:211 Foundations of Education, EDU:215 Principles of Teaching and Learning, EDU: 216 Teacher Education Portfolio Development.
- Completion of Education courses with a cumulative GPA of 2.500 or higher
- An overall cumulative GPA of 2.750
- An ACT composite score of 22 or higher or SAT score of 1010 or higher
- A score of 235 or higher on each subtest of the C-Base exam (The C-Base exam must be completed prior to transfer because all sections must be passed before entering Phase II.)

General information regarding the C-Base exam:

A student who does not meet the minimum required score may retake that section(s). Students will have two years from the first testing period to retake those portions of the exam in which they must raise their score. After two years, the entire exam must be retaken. A passing score is a Missouri Teacher Certification requirement. It is recommended students take this test after completing 45 hours of college credit. All sections must be completed and passed prior to transfer to MU.

- Completion of ENG:102 Exposition with a “C” range grade or higher
- Completion of MTH160 College Algebra with a “C” range grade or higher
- Completion of BUS:201 Elementary Statistics with a grade of “C” (2.000) or higher
- Completion of Application for Progression into Phase II of the MU Teacher Development Program. The application need to be submitted to the College of Education the semester prior to transfer from SLCC to MU (i.e. for Fall 2007 entrance, the application needs to be submitted in the Spring 2007 semester)

*Students seeking Elementary certification can choose to complete an approved Economics course and an approved Geography course. **MU requests that you complete the BUS: 201 Elementary Statistics as part of your AA degree or during the summer prior to transfer to MU. This course is part of the requirements to enter into Phase II of the program. Missouri State requirements for Elementary education also require a 21 hour concentration in one of 4 areas; Math, Science, Humanities and Fine Arts, or Social and Behavioral Sciences. If a student completes the above AA degree with the recommended coursework, they should have completed 18 of the 21 hours required in the Social and Behavioral Sciences concentration. Therefore, they would only need 3 additional hours in that area to equal the required 21.

NOTE: An additional requirement for graduating with this degree is that students must take and pass the College Basic Academic Skills Exam (CBASE) as part of the requirements to matriculate to MU and enter Phase II of the program.
