



This transfer guide is intended to help you prepare for your transfer from St. Charles Community College to the Bachelor of Arts in Communication degree at MU. *This plan is not a substitute for academic advising.* Before following this guide, we encourage you to contact an MU academic advisor for further information about degree requirements, course selection, and graduation requirements.

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Transfer Admission Requirements

Admission to Mizzou does not guarantee admission to the Communication degree. At the time of application to Mizzou, students interested in communication are first considered for general admission to MU and then for admission to pre-communication. Admitted students are considered pre-communication until they apply to communication. Students who are admissible to MU but are not admissible to pre-communication must choose another MU degree program.

Admission to Mizzou:

- Transfer students who meet MU's freshman admission requirements must have a 2.5 transfer GPA in college-level courses to be admitted.
- Transfer students who do not meet MU's freshman admission requirements must have:
 - A minimum of 24 transferable college-level credits;
 - A 2.5 GPA in transferable college-level courses; and
 - Either College Algebra with a C- or better or the equivalent to MU's English 1000 with a C- or better.
- Transfer students with an associate of arts (AA) degree from a regionally accredited Missouri community college are considered to have met the general transfer admission requirements.

Admission to Communication:

Because of interest in communication programs, admission is restricted. Students must apply for admission no earlier than the first semester of their sophomore year, or during the semester in which they will complete 45 credits. Transfer students are not eligible for admission until they have completed at least one semester in residence (12 credits) and a communication course in residence.

To be eligible for application to communication:

- Students must complete one semester of coursework at MU (at least 12 hours).
- Students must have a 2.500 UM cumulative GPA, but that does NOT guarantee admission. The UM GPA includes only grades from MU, UMSL, UMKC or Missouri S&T.
- A minimum of 45 semester hours of college-level credit must be completed.
- One communication course must be completed at the University of Missouri with a grade of B- or better. COMMUN 1200, 2100, or 3050 are suggested.
- Students need to have a competitive GPA in Communication courses completed at MU.
- MATH 1100 and ENGLSH 1000 must be completed.
