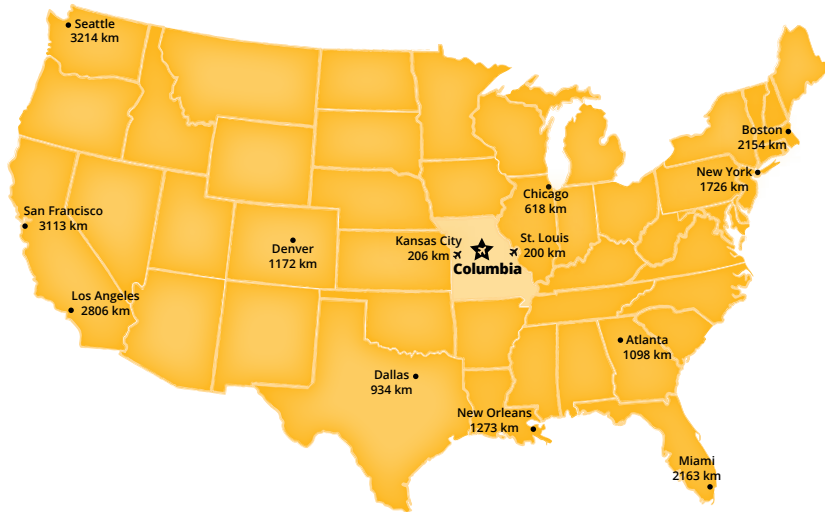

## GAIN A GLOBAL ADVANTAGE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI.

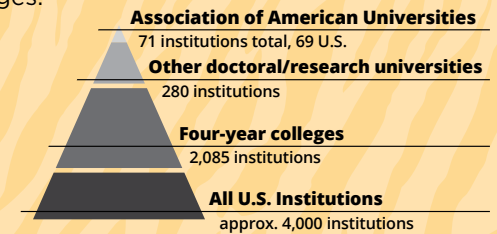

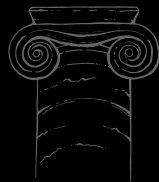

  - TOEFL/IELTS/DET scores
  - SAT/ACT scores (optional)

### TIMELINE

We recommend you apply six to 12 months before the start of the semester in which you want to enroll.

Apply for admission by Nov. 15 to allow time to meet our competitive scholarship deadlines.

# ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Every applicant whose native language is not English is required to demonstrate English proficiency by submitting an English exam score. Mizzou accepts: TOEFL, IELTS, DET<sup>†</sup>. Minimum scores are listed below.

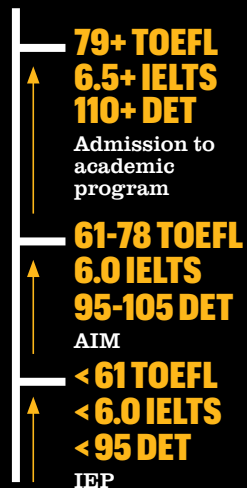

### ACADEMIC INTEGRATION @ MIZZOU PROGRAM

The AIM program supports international students who are ready for academic work but do not quite meet the minimum English language requirements. AIM students are admitted to their program with the exception of the College of Business and take a combination of both academic courses and English language support program (ELSP) courses.

### INTENSIVE ENGLISH PROGRAM

MU offers a full-time Intensive English Program (IEP) for students who do not meet minimum language requirements for admission, or for any student who wishes to study English as a second language.
