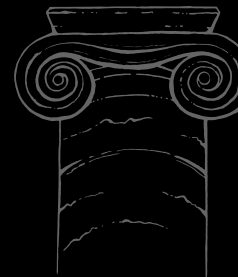

Our flagship campus offers an intellectually diverse environment and energetic culture.

With 1,963 dedicated faculty and instructors, Mizzou is one of 10 U.S. universities with law, medicine and veterinary medicine on one campus. MU is also one of only 38 public universities in the prestigious Association of American Universities (AAU).

Mizzou students represent all 50 states, every county in Missouri and more than 100 countries, giving you space to exchange world-changing ideas. Some of them just might be yours.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

You meet the requirements for admission if you have:

Completed the required high school curriculum with good grades

— AND —

Earned a composite ACT score of 24 or higher

— OR —

Earned an SAT score of 1160 or higher

— OR —

Scores lower than a 24 ACT or 1160 SAT will use a sliding scale to determine admission

TEST-OPTIONAL/ NO TEST SCORE

Freshman applicants for the fall 2025 term have the option of being reviewed test-optional. Choosing a test-optional review will mean your admissibility will be determined holistically by a committee. Indicate on your application for admission that you wish for your application to be reviewed without test scores (test-optional).

REQUIRED HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM

Students are expected to follow a college preparatory curriculum that includes at least 17 units of credit (one unit = one year in class).

English 4 units

One unit may be in speech or debate. Two units emphasizing composition or writing skills are required.

Mathematics 4 units

Algebra I and higher

Science 3 units

One unit must be a laboratory course.

Social studies 3 units

Foreign language 2 units

Same language

Fine art 1 units

SUPERSCORES

Mizzou will accept superscores from both ACT and SAT. Students must request their superscore be sent directly to Mizzou from ACT. SAT superscores will be calculated from all official SAT scores sent to Mizzou from the College Board.

HOW TO APPLY

1. Submit Your Application

Apply anytime after Aug. 1 of your senior year and by Nov. 15 to maximize scholarship eligibility. There is no application deadline. You can choose to submit test scores or complete a test-optional application.

2. Send Your Transcripts

Request that your high school send your official transcripts directly to Mizzou.

3. Share Your Test Scores

If you choose to have your test scores considered with your application, request that your official scores be sent directly from the testing service.
