Nonresident scholarships are available to U.S. citizens and permanent residents only. Nonresident distance students admitted into an online program are not eligible for automatic scholarships due to paying a different tuition rate.

The most distinguished applicants will become semifinalists and will be notified of the next steps in the interview process.
Mizzou Scholars Award (Missouri only)	\$11,000	Must be a Missouri resident first-time college student with 33–36 ACT or 1450–1600 SAT and excellent academic record.	An application for admission, a resume and essay must be submitted by Dec. 1. A committee will review candidates' credentials and supplemental material. Strongest consideration will be given to the strength of the academic record. Cannot be combined with Perfect Score or National Merit awards.

SAVE \$20,000+ PER YEAR WITH LOWER, IN-STATE TUITION.

THE BASICS OF MISSOURI RESIDENCY:

- Live in Missouri for 12 consecutive months (August–August)
- Missouri driver's license
- Missouri voter registration
- Job in Missouri earning at least \$3,000 of taxable income
- Student cannot be claimed as a dependent on a federal income tax return in another state.

MORE ABOUT GAINING RESIDENCY:

- Residency takes one full year, which may start when you begin classes in August of your freshman year.
- You'll be paying nonresident tuition until you are granted residency.
- Once you become a Missouri resident, you will no longer be eligible for any automatic or competitive scholarships.
- You must fill out an application and provide all required documentation.

Unless noted, all of these scholarships/fee reductions require recipients to enroll at Mizzou the first semester after high school graduation. Some scholarships/fee reductions are subject to change without notice. They are not to be regarded as offers to contract. Financial aid awards from all sources (federal, state, institutional or private aid) may not exceed the annual cost of attendance assigned by Mizzou. Scholarships are only applicable to the fall and spring semesters; therefore, students cannot receive these awards in the summer semester. Students starting in the middle of the academic year (spring term) will receive half of the scholarship award for their first term of entry. Scholarships requiring a separate application (including Stamps, Mizzou Scholars and all Honors College scholarships) have a due date of Dec. 1. The recommended date to apply for admission to meet this deadline is Nov. 15.

† Tuition and fees include direct costs that are part of the estimated cost of attendance calculated by Student Financial Aid. This number does not include estimates for indirect costs, such as books, supplies, personal expenses or transportation. Amounts and requirements are subject to change at any time. However, any tuition or fee increases must be approved by the University of Missouri Board of Curators 30 days prior to the beginning of the academic term. Any approved revision of tuition and fees is effective regardless of whether they have been paid prior to the revision.
