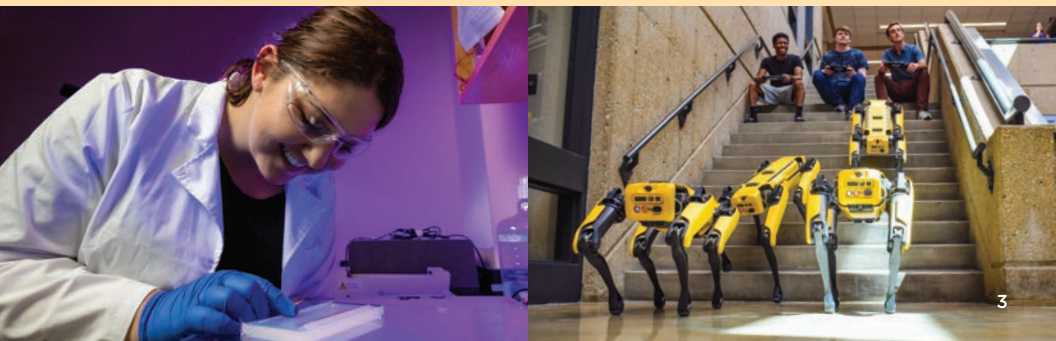
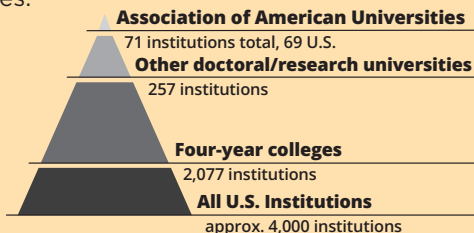

Every applicant whose native language is not English is required to demonstrate English proficiency by submitting an English exam score. Mizzou accepts: TOEFL, IELTS, DET<sup>†</sup>. Minimum scores are listed below.

## ACADEMIC INTEGRATION @ MIZZOU (AIM) PROGRAM

The AIM program supports international students who are ready for academic work but do not quite meet the minimum English language requirements. Students in academic programs from the Colleges of Arts and Science, Engineering, and Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources with scores of 61-78 on the TOEFL, a 6.0 IELTS, or a 95-105 on the DET are admitted to their program and take academic coursework as well as English language support program (ELSP) courses.
