

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
MOBERLY AREA COMMUNITY COLLEGE
AND
UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI**

Associate of Arts to Bachelor of Social Work

OVERVIEW:

This formal program of articulation agreement is made and entered into by the University of Missouri, hereinafter referred to as MU, and the Junior College District of the Moberly Area, Moberly, Missouri, (Moberly Area Community College) hereinafter referred to as MACC. By this agreement, MACC and MU express a shared commitment to increasing opportunities for student access to and success in higher education. By clarifying transfer policies and procedures which assure articulation between programs, the institutions seek to assist students in making a seamless transfer from the associate to the baccalaureate degree.

PURPOSE:

This agreement provides students who have earned an **Associate of Arts** degree with an Emphasis in Social Work the opportunity to complete a **Bachelor of Social Work** at MU. Any MACC student who has earned an Associate of Arts degree is guaranteed that MU will accept all courses designated within this articulation agreement and will apply such to the Bachelor of Social Work degree in a manner consistent with the treatment of native students.

CONDITIONS OF TRANSFER:

MACC students maintaining continuous enrollment under this agreement will be afforded the same treatment and protections as MU native students enrolled under a specific catalog.

Criteria for acceptance into MU for transfer students is based upon their past academic performance and the admissions requirements for the Bachelor of Social Work degree.

MACC, upon request of students, will provide verification of completed courses to MU through its School of Social Work.

The transcript of students transferring from MACC will be evaluated by the MU Office of Admissions.

Transfer students from MACC will have access to financial aid and student services on the same basis as native students.

Minimum grade standards for academic progress and graduation from MACC will be subject to no further review by MU.

MU will apply the same academic progress and graduation standards to MACC transfer students as those applicable to native students at MU.

SECTION II: TRANSFER OF CREDIT AND ADMISSION TO DEGREE PROGRAM

While there is no maximum number of credit hours that can be transferred by a student from MACC to MU, 30 of the last 36 semester hours of credit must be completed with MU authored courses.

Transfer students from MACC who have completed the Associate of Arts degree, upon acceptance into the Bachelor of Social Work Professional Program at MU, will have junior standing at MU.

Transfer students must have earned at least a 2.50 cumulative grade point average for admission into the School of Social Work.

The following **Liberal Arts Pre-requisites Courses** (or their equivalents) **must be completed prior to beginning** the first semester of the Professional BSW Core Courses. All courses, excluding Anthropology and American History or Government, require a grade in the "C" range or higher.

Admission to the MU BSW Professional Program is competitive. Completion of the coursework contained in this articulation agreement does not guarantee admission to the BSW Professional Program.

Transfer students are accepted into the BSW Professional Program only in the spring semester for students to begin the program in the fall. Applicants must submit a separate application including personal statement and references between February 15–May 15 for fall admission. Students are encouraged to obtain applications no later than January of the calendar year in which they wish to be considered for fall semester admission. Applications are available at <http://ssw.missouri.edu/bswapp.shtml>. The regular deadline for submission of the application is February 15 by 4:00 p.m., and the late deadline is May 15 by 4:00 p.m. If the deadline falls on a weekend or MU holiday, the deadline is the first business day thereafter.






